Greetings Brothers,

With a new year comes a new 20 Week Club! The purpose of the 20 Week Club is to award two, \$2,500 scholarships to eight-grade students graduating in June 2021 and continuing their education at a Catholic high school. Eighth-grade Catholic students, who are residents of Rochelle Park or Saddle Brook, or the child, grandchild, brother or sister of a member or a deceased member of Council 2842, are eligible. *We are also looking to donate any additional money to the Paramus Veterans Home.*

The 20 Week Club is a rolling raffle. Every Friday beginning March 19, a \$150 winner will be drawn. Tickets will remain in the raffle box until the event is completed on July 30. ***An additional \$25 will be awarded to the seller of the weekly winning ticket.*** At the July 30th finale, we will draw the final \$150 winner plus three grand prize winners; \$1,250, \$900 and \$600. Every ticket holder is welcome to attend the finale where food and fun will be provided (COVID-19 restrictions may alter the finale).

Tickets are \$25 each. This year our goal is to break 900, but we need your help to sell the tickets you have received. This is a great way for all members to contribute to the council.

So, for \$1.25 (cost of a 20-week ticket is 25) the owner of a ticket has a chance to win \$150 each week. And then on the 20th week has the chance to win one of 3 grand prizes as well as enjoy a buffet dinner, all for the price of one ticket! (COVID-19 restrictions may alter)

Dear Brothers,

Happy Lent! Just a few notes regarding Palm Sunday services at Sacred Heart. Masses are 4 and 5:30PM on Saturday and 10AM and 12PM on Sunday. All are welcome to attend, as we often say "There are no strangers at Sacred Heart, just friends we have not yet met". Masks must be worn by all throughout the mass NO EXCEPTIONS.

Unlike what we did for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, we will not be doing preregistration for Palm Sunday or Easter, it will be first come first serve. We are allowed 135 in our worship space (120 in the main body and an additional 15 in the choir loft). Ushers will escort you to your seats upon arriving at mass. Ushers have been instructed to close all doors to the church either once we have reached our 135 capacity or once I begin to proclaim the Gospel (whichever comes first). Due to our limited capacity and the fact that we will only be utilizing every

other pew, space will be limited, may I suggest arriving to mass a little early, for as we know as with Christmas, pews will fill up quickly.

To maximize space, we kindly ask that if you will be attending alone or with at least one other person to try to sit in the front of the church in the smaller pews as to save the larger pews in the back of the church for our larger families.

Our schedule for Eater Sunday worship will be the same as Palm Sunday. We thank you very much for your cooperation and look forward to seeing you at worship.

In a personal note, I am on the mend, praise God! I went to Holy Name Hospital on February 13 and had what is called a monoclonal antibody infusion, the best known and latest treatment for the COVID virus.

I want to thank everyone for all your thoughts, prayers and food! I have been overwhelmed by your love and I am truly blessed to be your Pastor and Chaplain. Little did I know last March when I was preaching with no congregation about hope and trust during this pandemic that I would be placing my trust in God's hands with my own health, but this is what faith is really all about. You, this community have helped me grow in my faith and trust of God, and I thank you for that.
